## "Exploring the dark side of our past"



Field trip led by Prof. Gabriele Simoncini, Ph.D. Columbia University, NY.

The field trip is based in Krakow, Poland, the capital city of a region that witnessed some of the greatest atrocities in European history. The visit focuses on a diversity of identities including Polish, Jewish, German, Ukrainian and Romani ("Gypsies)" in their historical context. Prof. Simoncini accompanies students throughout the country in which he lived for many years, lecturing on the historical, political and sociological aspects of the area and the genocidal policies that it suffered under both Nazi and Communist regimes. Students will be guided through the region, seeing for themselves the places that witnessed the worst crimes in recent history and honoring those that suffered there.

Thursday 14 <sup>th</sup>	Recommended flight Ryan Air from Ciampino (CIA) to Krakow (KRK) 11:35am. Arrival in Krakow airport at 1:40pm.
	Train transfer to Hotel.

	Check in at the hotel. Free time to explore the city and walk to <b>Wawel Castle</b> , stroll around and admire the surrounding scenic <b>Vistula</b> river, the <b>Main Market Square</b> and the <b>Mariacki Cathedral</b> .
Friday 15 <sup>th</sup> 9:00am-1:30pm	Meet punctually in the hotel lobby and go visit <b>Kazimierz</b> , Krakow's historical Jewish District. You'll experience the unique context of historical synagogues, marketplaces, narrow streets, cemeteries, and tenement houses. Then, we'll head on to the <b>Jewish Ghetto</b> to visit the main square and the wall's remains. Finally, you'll get to see the original <b>Oskar Schindler's Factory</b> , now a museum.
1:30pm – 2:30pm	Free time for lunch.
<u>2:30pm – 5:30pm</u>	Transfer by private coach to <b>Wieliczka</b> town and <b>Salt Mine</b> . We visit a mining site which had been functioning continuously from the Middle Ages to 1996. Wieliczka Salt Mine is also a world class monument, as it holds twelve items featured on the UNESCO's World Cultural and Natural Heritage List.  We will explore the subterranean wonder world with its numerous corridors, caverns, lakes and chapels – all hidden deep underground. Return to hotel.
8:00pm	Traditional Polish dinner in the <b>Main Market Square</b> , included in the program.
<u>Saturday 16<sup>th</sup></u> 7:30am – 12:30pm	Depart by private coach to <b>Auschwitz-Birkenau</b> , the largest of Nazi Germany's death camps and the site of the worst human atrocity of modern time.  Return to hotel.
Sunday 17 <sup>th</sup>	Free afternoon.
9:00am - 1:00pm	Check out from hotel and luggage storage. Visit <b>Nowa Huta</b> industrial town, the most relevant Polish example of Communist utopia in social and architectural experimentation, including genocidal policies.
12:00pm-2:00pm	Lunch in a typical Communist restaurant, included in the program.
<u>2:00pm</u>	Return to Radisson Hotel. Program ends.
	Free afternoon. <u>Students must provide their own transportation to Krakow airport.</u>
<u>8:50pm</u>	Recommended flight Ryan Air from Krakow (KRK) to Ciampino (CIA) at 8:50pm. Arrival in Ciampino airport at 10:50pm.
